## WE'VE HIRED AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR!

In February 2012, the Board of Directors of ABWF selected David Kallenbach to serve as the Executive Director of the A-B Wilderness Foundation.


David came to Montana in 1996 as an outdoor educator and field instructor for the Voyager Outward Bound School, based in Red Lodge. For 13 years, he led trips for Outward Bound in the Absaroka-Beartooth Wilderness-an experience he says secured his deep admiration for the vast wild places of the Greater Yellowstone. He headed the Montana Program for Outward Bound from 2002-2008.

David sees his work for the ABWF as a natural extension of the work he started with Outward Bound. "So many students coming off Outward Bound courses were profoundly struck by the effects the wilderness had upon them." The ABWF similarly seeks to build peoples' relationships and involvement with this Wilderness. "I want to raise people's awareness as to just how special this place is, what's valuable and essential, and why we need to preserve it. So few people know much about what's here in their own backyard.

The ABWF also connects people with volunteer projects that directly benefit the wilderness. David shares his own personal example: "Once, I got set on climbing all of Colorado's 14,000 ft. peaks, but this activity got so popular that the impacts on those big mountains were impossible to ignore. It was hard not to see that my own climbing passion was part of the problem." David started volunteering on week-long trail projects sponsored by the Colorado 14'ers Initiative and the Forest Service. "We worked hard establishing trails on those peaks, but it never seemed like hard work because we kept it fun, got to know people who shared our passion for the outdoors, and saw the fruits of our labors at the end of each day." The A-B Wilderness is not immune to these kinds of impacts. This summer, the ABWF is sponsoring some trail projects, weed projects, and science projects that each need volunteers' help. David grew up hiking, camping, and mountain climbing in the mountains of Colorado. His family took every opportunity to appreciate the Parks, Forests, and Wilderness Areas across the country. Motivated to share the natural world with others, he completed his B.A. in Environmental Biology and M.A. in Science Education at the University of Colorado and taught high school science for eight years in Denver, Boulder, and in the Peace Corps in Papua New Guinea. He has also worked as a ranger/naturalist for the National Park Service, most recently in Denali National Park, Alaska.

For his own part, David's earliest forays into the A-B left a big impression. "One can travel for weeks without seeing another soul," he says. "The solitude affects me the most...the quiet, the intimate connection with nature, the heightening of awareness...You funnel all your social energies into what's directly around you, and see things you wouldn't normally see...The A-B Wilderness is like no other place I've been, in its magnitude, its pristineness, and its remote, rugged terrain. It's truly one of a kind."

## VOLUNTEER FOR THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS!

### Trail Projects:

- August 2-7, Wed-Mon,-Upper Red Lodge Creek Trail Camp-Join our work crew as we reroute and create a new section of trail on the Red Lodge Creek Plateau. We'll camp near the trailhead and work on the plateau over a multi-day span. Meals are provided.

### Weed Projects:

- July 27 and 28, Fri & Sat-Mill Creek to Passage Creek. Help eradicate noxious weeds! From the Paradise Valley, we need 2-3 hikers for a couple days documenting and treating Dalmatian Toadflax along heavily-used Mill Creek.
- August 18, Sat: ABWF will be teaming with the E. Rosebud Homeowner's Association to knock out invasive weeds along Spread Cr. or up to Elk Lake.

### Science and Education Projects:

- September 4-7, Tues-Fri, Yellowstone Cutthroat Trout project: We need 2-3 volunteers to provide public information about the reintroduction of Yellowstone Cutthroat Trout along the Boulder River south of Big Timber.
- Glacier Monitoring: Scientists, students, and volunteers will head into the backcountry to precisely measure and document the A-B's endangered high alpine glaciers. Two short (3-4 day) expeditions are planned for late summer. Watch our website for dates.
- Whitebark Pine Survey: ABWF is helping initiate a project with the USFS to examine the effects of pine beetle & blister rust on the iconic Whitebark Pine in the Wilderness. Dates in late July & August are being planned, and we'll need a number of hiker/volunteers.
